About CIRCULAR: Challenges for the implementation of Circular Economy policies: practices, institutions and hybrid intersections

CIRCULAR is a three year research project funded by the Fonds National de la Recherche Luxembourg (FNR).

Changing from the current linear model to Circular Economy is a challenging process of change at all levels of society, including Governments, businesses, social actors and private individuals. The research is focusing on the dynamics between Circular Economy policies and activities of firms, business

associations, and civil organizations. This will include how firms are responding to Circular Economy policies, possible challenges and potential they accouter and the circular activities and practices in firms or under development. We will also investigate the role of civil organizations and social enterprises in the development towards a circular society, especially how they influence public behavior and firm activities.

CIRCULAR will consider two case regions, the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and the region of Västra Götaland in Sweden. In both regions, we will be focusing on the automotive supply industry and the building industry as well on civil society organizations and community initiatives such as food cycles, repair workshops and second hand markets.
